### YOUTH LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

Canbina's Youth Leadership Program starts in Year 10 and runs for three years. During that time, participants meet leaders from different industry sectors; take part in special regional, metropolitan and national events; and learn how to develop their own leadership skills.

The recent six day 2022 Year 10 Sydney/Melbourne Tour was jam packed meeting people from the financial services, community, social enterprise, education, entertainment and sporting sectors; tackling team building and leadership activities; taking in the famous sights; and exploring the cities by ferry, bus and tram.

In Sydney, the group met with the AMP Foundation, the Redfern National Centre of Indigenous Excellence and the Redfern Community Centre. The Melbourne itinerary included visits to the Ngarara Willim Centre at RMIT, Ganbina's Melbourne office, ANZ, Crown Resorts and the Collingwood Football Club.

"The highlight for me was learning more about Indigenous culture and what organisations are doing to apply Indigenous support on an everyday level. It was my first time in Sydney, so that was really cool. It was good to find out about how Sydney started and what it is like today, and in particular the history of Redfern.

"I enjoyed the workshop that ANZ ran for us and it was really interesting to learn about all the things that they do apart from daily banking. There are so many different roles that people do there. Architecturally, the building was also really great.
