GANBINA GOES DIGITAL

In 2020, we upgraded our infrastructure to enable our staff to work remotely during COVID-19. This year, we have begun work on another major initiative - to fully digitise our JOBS4U2 Program for participants.


This will have a significant impact on the lives of young Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, both now and in the future.

Firstly, it will eliminate time-consuming administration for participants, their families and their Project Officers. This will allow them to focus more on what matters most – setting goals, creating personal development plans and one-on-one mentoring.

Secondly, it will have substantial implications for our Expansion Program, because young people will be able to access JOBS4U2 Program content and activities from anywhere in the world.

Scoping of the project with strategic business consultants, atticusnow, is well underway; and we expect to complete it within the next two years.

Stage 1 of the digitisation project will be launched in December this year, with the introduction of fully automated registration for 2022 Program participants.





EMPOWR ROAD SAFETY INITIATIVE

Canbina's Driver Skills Training Program provides professional driving instructors to teach young people in the Coulburn Valley to drive safely and well so that they can better access study and work opportunities.

We are delighted to announce an extension to the Program this year – a foundation partnership with the EMPOWR Research Project – in conjunction with the TAC, Monash University Accident Research Centre, and the National Road Safety Partnership Program (NRSPP).

Two Ganbina participants have been chosen to take part in this important Australia-wide project. Researchers will evaluate travel data collected from safe cars provided to our participants over a three month period.

EMPOWR aims to get a better understanding of the enablers and barriers to support young drivers into safer vehicles, and to promote safer driving behaviour.

If the outcomes are successful, safer vehicles will be offered on a larger scale to young drivers across Australia at an affordable price.
