FOR THE DIARY - Year 12 Transition Workshop - with a trip to ESCAPE, SMASH, PLAY Shepparton!



If you're a Year 12 student enrolled in Ganbina's Jobs4U2 education program, you have access to the upcoming Year 12 transition workshop, which will include a free trip to Escape, Smash, Play Shepparton!

The workshop aims to help current Year 12 students with their goals and aspirations after Year 12. The workshop is an opportunity to come together with other Ganbina Year 12 Koorie students to talk about what they may like to do once they complete Year 12 and how Ganbina can support them post-Year 12, up until the age of 25.

The workshop will help students develop an action plan for how they are going to achieve that dream job or university study path, and also involve team building activities and discussions on finding out who you are as an individual! Dayna (Ganbina's Education and Training Project Officer) will be able to help with any assistance or support students may need.

For example, Dayna can help workshop participants:

- Start thinking about what they want to achieve after they complete school
 - Apply for university and/or TAFE courses
- · Find out what subjects they will need to study in order to pursue their dream career
- Find a job directly after completing Year 12, e.g. casual/after university job or permanent parttime or full-time work
 - Long-term goal planning (i.e. Where do you see yourself five years from now?)
 - What support Ganbina can offer participants aged 18-25

The workshop includes a trip to the new Escape, Smash and Play in Shepparton for an interactive team-building activity and a pizza dinner.
