Internal Primary School support for English and Cultural Yarns for term 3!

If you're a Ganbina participant who is registered for our Primary School Program and in Grade 3-6, you can express your interest and access our English and Cultural Yarn tutoring in Term 3.

The Accelerated Learning Program provides Internal tutoring in English and Maths in a culturally safe space for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students at Ganbina.

Our Maths tutoring program has been underway with roughly 23 participants registered for term 2. We are not too far off from the students completing this as it ends in June and then we kick start the English and Cultural Yarn tutoring in the second week of term 3 on Monday July 22nd.

When you are registered for English tutoring, you will also have an opportunity to learn more about the Yorta Yorta and Bangerang culture and history through the Cultural Yarn element of

the tutoring program.

Our tutoring support embeds culture throughout each lesson and includes teaching of cultural knowledge and practices. We also encourage our participants to speak about their own mobs, connections and develop confidence and pride in their cultural identity, and if they don't know as much, we encourage them to go home and have a yarn with family and come back to share with the group.

EMPLOYMENT & TRAINING – That's a wrap on the 2024 Careers Night!





YOUTH LEADERSHIP PROGRAM – Our future leaders are getting ready for Cairns after a deadly trip to Melbourne and Sydney



Our Youth Leadership Program participants have recently completed their first unique trip to Melbourne and Sydney and are gearing up for another deadly trip to Cairns in the next school holidays in July.

This year 14 year 11 students were successfully recruited for our Ganbina Youth Leadership Program, which is a one year program. The students range from schools in the Goulburn Valley including Greater Shepparton Secondary College, Notre Dame College, Numurkah Secondary, St Anne's College and Goulburn Valley Grammar.

The Melbourne and Sydney trip was the first time many of our participants had flown interstate or at least travelled independently. This trip offered participants an opportunity to learn and be exposed to other Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander history, explore corporate career pathways, further Education opportunities, and enjoy group activities.
