As we enter the third quarter of the year, another year of Jobs4U2 will soon come to a close.

This year will be our 26th year of delivering our school-to-work transition program for Aboriginal children and youth in the Goulburn Valley.

In 2023, Jobs4U2 registered 372 Aboriginal children and youth. This is an increase on our 2022 program numbers of 346.

For the remainder of the year, our staff will be focused on supporting our participants as many of them approach the final few months of the schooling year, including Year 12 graduation.

The end of year will include our annual Aboriginal Youth Achievement Awards. An annual gala dinner where we recognise Goulburn Valley Aboriginal youth achievements in education, training and employment. It is a lovely way to end the year and always a highlight on the Ganbina calendar.

Ganbina Highlight: Yr 11 & 12 Youth Leadership Program trip to New Zealand

One of the highlights on the Ganbina calendar for our Year 11 and Year 12 leadership program participants is the annual trip to New Zealand.

To encourage more Aboriginal youth to remain in mainstream education, Ganbina participants who join the Youth Leadership Program and are in Year 11 or 12, are able to go on an all-expenses paid week-long trip to New Zealand.

For many of the participants, this is their first trip overseas. They are also often the first in their family to have a passport and travel internationally.

"I tell the kids to not drop out of school like I did"

Ganbina has recently welcomed a new staff member in our Shepparton office. Brad Argaet has joined the team as a Project Officer.

A Yorta Yorta man, Brad was one of those Aboriginal youth who dropped out of the education system by Year 9. As an adult, Brad regrets not completing secondary school and uses his life experience to encourage Ganbina's Aboriginal youth to not make the same mistake he did. In this Q&A he speaks about his experience growing up as an Aboriginal youth in Shepparton and how he's finding his new role.

How did the opportunity to apply for the Project Officer role come about?

It was a conversation with Lisa (Ganbina staff member) when I brought in my nephew to the Ganbina office several years ago. She suggested I work for Ganbina and I was off work at the time due to being on Workcover. I kept it in the back of my mind and when I was ready to return to work, there was a role available. So it was good timing.

Ash is a proud Wiradjuri woman who grew up on Wurundjeri and Bunurong Country and is now based on Taungurung Country in North Central Victoria. She holds a Bachelor of Arts (Media and Communications) from the University of Melbourne and a Master's degree in Applied Cultural Analysis from Lunds University in Sweden.

Her industry experience has focused on advancing Indigenous success and restorative justice in both the corporate and public sectors. She obtained a PhD from the University of Newcastle detailing the history of the NSW Aboriginal Protection Board throughout the 1930s and the Welfare Board throughout the 40s. Her current research agenda focuses on the Indigenous future of work, regional Indigenous business development and access and youth leadership.
